Outcome of Directors' Meeting

A look at the Directors' Minutes gives an overview of how sessions are to be conducted. This is well worth a read to help understand the role of directors and what is expected from the players.

Law 73 covers improper communication.

Some beginners tend to make comments across the table or show some reaction, as in facial expressions. A gentle explanation is usually the best way, rather than calling for the Director. That's not to say the Director should not be called, just be mindful of the way in which you call 'Director, please'.

Slow Play Law 90

Time setting for each round....

Red Point Events

7 Minutes per board.

Green Point Sessions

Mitchell Movements

7 minutes per board less 1 minute for 3 boards, Less 2 minutes for 4 boards Less 3 minutes for 5 boards

Howell Movements

7 Minutes per board

Penalty for Slow Play

The players must have finished bidding their last board and the lead card made on the 3-minute bell. In the instance that there is slow play, please call the Director.

Director to state the 3 minutes left on the clock, warning players to speed up. Otherwise, the board can be taken away, with an Average Minus to the offending side/s.

Law 90 Procedural Penalties

Covers slow play as well as 7 other infringements. The Guideline for Directors are 'How many Tables have finished their quota of boards?

Announcements before Play, reminding players of their Duties

Directors Reminder Sheet will be put into effect as from 13th January 2024

Bridgemates and Entries

It is the E/W duty to read the entry into the Bridgemates and to accept the entry as a true record. If you have a query, please call the Director.

At the end of session, please ensure that your Bridgemate has gone to 'End of Session'.

Law 74 Conduct and Etiquette

Proper behaviour and good manners prevail.

Everyone is entitled to enjoy their game.

Respect partner, opponents, and Director.

Law 41 Opening Lead

The Opening Lead is made by the person on Declarer's left.

Law 54 There are 5 options.

If the lead comes from the wrong hand, call "Director, please".

a/ Declarer lays his cards on the table, accepting the lead. Dummy then becomes the Declarer.

b/ Declarer accepts the lead but wants to play the hand. Dummy's hand is now laid on the table.

Declarer can see the Dummy's cards, but must play from his own hand first, (Clockwise).

c/ Declarer has seen any of Dummy's cards exposed during the auction; he MUST accept the lead.

d/ Declarer refuses the lead. Withdrawn card becomes a major penalty card.

(Law 50D applies).

e/ If a player from the Declaring side attempts to make an opening lead, Law 24 applies. (The card gets picked up and placed back into hand.

Declarer, please consider all options before making their choice.

Law 64 Revoke

If the offending player wins the trick on the revoke, 1 trick is given to the non-offending side, plus one more trick if the offending side wins another trick after the revoke.

If the offender doesn't win the trick with the revoke, but wins subsequent tricks, one trick is given to the non-offending side.

(Director, please note the contract, as the failure to play to the suit may affect the overall result. ie No Trumps contract).

Law 79 Scoring Error

C.1 If a scoring error is found during session time, the Director is to be called to correct the error. After session time, players have 30 minutes to contact the Director of the error. If both sides agree, Director will amend the error.

C.2 Subject to Tournament Organiser, a scoring error may be corrected and the expiry of the Correction Period, if the Director is satisfied beyond reasonable doubt that the record is wrong.

System Cards

It is the policy of R.B.C. Inc that in greenpoint sessions, one system card per pair is to be at the table. Two system cards at Red Point and Gold Point events.

All system cards to be filled out clearly.

Instruction of the Laws

Director to read Handy Hints before start of session.



Statistically, 6 out of 7 dwarfs are not Happy.


My neighbour knocked on my door at 2:30am this morning, can you believe that, 2:30am. Luckily for him, I was still up playing my Bagpipes.
