At Seniors Expo Days, run by the City of Rockingham, Diane can be found setting up and manning the Club stall, encouraging passersby to have a go and perhaps come to our introductory Morning Teas.

Diane is well known Statewide in the bridge world and is a staunch promoter of Rockingham and surrounds as a wonderful place to visit (and play Bridge).

Strictly speaking, RBC is not a Volunteering Organisation as that is not our core work, but we were commended for our fundraising efforts on behalf of another group. People born in June are great communicators and can easily draw everyone's attention.






